## From the Desk of the Chief...

Traffic safety has always been a top priority for your Citrus Heights Police Department, and any urban community with significant traffic traversing

through its borders would be smart to implement strategies to ensure traffic safety. During calendar year 2015,



Citrus Heights experienced 711 collisions, six of which resulted in a fatality. During calendar year 2016, Citrus Heights experienced 859 collisions, five of which were fatalities, and so far in 2017, we have already experienced four traffic collision related fatalities. A study of the four fatality collisions indicate each was unique in itself and had no similarities in regards to the causation. An analysis of the behaviors of the involved parties in each of the 2017 fatal collisions suggests traffic safety education and messaging as a reasonable countermeasure to help reduce the number of traffic collision fatalities.

CHPD is launching a Traffic-Pedestrian Safety Campaign that was designed to reduce traffic collisions and collision related fatalities in an effort to keep our roadways safe. The Traffic-Pedestrian Safety Campaign will also seek to identify potential commonalities with non-injury and injury collisions in Citrus Heights as they occur throughout the year. Motor vehicle collisions generally involve multiple contributing factors, which means the approach to reducing the collisions must be multidisciplinary in nature. Zero fatalities is a realistic goal as it has already been accomplished by the Citrus Heights Police Department in 2014. To achieve this goal again, the Traffic-Pedestrian Safety Campaign will provide continuous traffic related educational opportunities for the community using innovative educational outreach methods such as social media and will be followed up with a strict traffic enforcement plan. The campaign will concentrate on the three "E's" of the traffic safety model which include an emphasis on education, engineering, and enforcement.

*Education* necessitates a consistent message and reminder for motorists and pedestrians to maintain an awareness of laws, safe practices, and common-sense when traversing our roadways. The more we talk about traffic safety and instill an awareness of the dangers associated with motor vehicles, the more likely we will be to ensure we have safe motorists on our roadways. Education goes beyond our police professionals broadcasting the message.

### From the Desk of the Chief...

We encourage our community members to "pay it forward" by educating others with the same message they received, particularly with younger drivers. Explaining the importance of safe driving habits is critical for parents and family members to instill at an early age to new drivers.



**Engineering** requires the careful review of our roadways, signals, traffic movement, and anything that may help improve or impede safe traffic flow. Our traffic professionals and engineers review roadways to ensure compliance with the law and implementation of best practices to strive for the safest environment possible.

**Enforcement** imposes a level of accountability that our community expects for their roadways. Without enforcement, traffic safety is merely a suggestion, and not a requirement for following the rules of the road. Traffic enforcement serves the purpose of reducing traffic collisions and traffic related fatalities by identifying bad driving habits that lead to collisions. Our only objective for traffic enforcement is to reduce collisions and save lives. Our Traffic Team and patrol officers regularly focus their enforcement efforts in areas throughout the City where a high number of collisions occur based on collision data.

We also conduct enforcement in areas we receive neighborhood complaints about, which are typically speeding or stop-sign violation complaints. Our photo red light enforcement program continues to be an important element of our enforcement strategy and has proven to be effective in reducing collisions. Currently there are seven intersections throughout the City equipped with a total of eight red light cameras, which were selected based upon collision data, with additional intersections currently under consideration.

We invite you to join us in helping to reduce traffic collisions in Citrus Heights by always maintaining an awareness of good driving and pedestrian habits. We can't do this alone, but with your assistance, we might be able to save more lives by making our roadways a little safer.

#### May is Microchip Month!

Measure the worth of a microchip! Fast, easy, inexpensive, the size of a rice grain, and lasts a lifetime!

- A pet is lost every 7 seconds!
   One in three pets will become
- lost during their lifetime.
- 10 million dogs and cats are lost or stolen every year in the US.
- Only 17 percent of lost dogs are reunited with their owners.
- Less than 2 percent of lost cats are reunited with their owners.
- Only <u>58 percent</u> of microchipped animals have correct contact information. Maintain current address and phone records with the microchip company or free microchip registry.
- Chipped pets are 20 times more likely to be reunited with owners! (CHAS will try to return a microchipped pet the same day it is found!)
- Check the chip! Have pets scanned at their annual veterinary exam.
- Pets with ID (chips) are held at shelters longer than strays!
- Save your pet's life! Should your pet be sick or injured while lost and need urgent veterinary care, a chip helps us contact you faster!
- Microchips can cover time and distance—chipped pets who were missing for months or were miles away were returned to owners when scanned by a vet.
- Include microchip information when licensing. (Mandatory in some jurisdictions.)
- Lifetime licensing is also now available for altered cats with microchips in Citrus Heights.



## **Planning Division**


The Planning Division coordinates the City's review of residential and commercial development projects. The Planning Division evaluates the project for compliance with the City's General Plan, Zoning Code, and other City Standards. Below is a selected list of projects currently under review:

- 7925 Arcadia Drive Mitchell Farms. An application has been received to develop a 39 acre parcel into a new development with a variety of housing types for a total of 261 units.
  - 6550 Greenback Lane Quantum Care Place. An application has been received to construct a 63 bed memory care and assisted living facility on a vacant lot.
- 7534 Old Auburn Road Bearpaw Village. Review for the development of a 43-unit townhome project.
- 7056 Sunrise Blvd Arco Gas Station and Car Wash. Review of a Use Permit and Design Review Permit to allow the construction and operation of a new gas station with convenience store and car wash.

## **WaterSmart**

The City of Citrus Heights, Citrus Heights Water District, and EcoLandscape California are hosting two FREE WaterSmart Landscape Workshops this summer.


Both workshops are based on the principles of River-Friendly Landscaping, which aims to reduce landscape water use and wasteful run off, require less maintenance, energy, and pesticides, and produce less green waste, while improving soil and plant health. In addition to being healthier for the residents and our community, this approach helps keep our watershed healthy too.

The first workshop, "Getting the Best Yard with the Least Water" will be held on Saturday, June 10, 2017. This three-hour workshop for home gardeners covers all the basics of River-Friendly gardening, focusing on plant selection and irrigation.

This workshop addresses selecting, grouping, and spacing climate-appropriate plants; understanding the water-use requirements of various plants; converting/upgrading irrigation systems, including converting traditional pop-up sprinklers to rotary and precision nozzles and converting spray systems to low-volume drip; emitter placement for plant establishment and maturity; irrigation system components; and online tools for irrigation scheduling and other River-Friendly Landscaping topics.

The second workshop, "Designing Eco-Friendly Landscapes and Water-Wise Irrigation Systems" will be held on Saturday, June 24, 2017, at the Citrus Heights Community Center. This three-hour workshop for home gardeners will be led by EcoLandscape California's professionals from the Association of Professional Landscape Designers and Qualified Green Gardeners.

Attendees will learn how to infuse their personal artistic style into a beautiful, eco-friendly landscape which will meet their needs. Attendees also learn how to design a water-wise irrigation system to insure the success of their landscape.
