### From the Office of the Chief

Those who know me best know I am a "pet-friendly" police chief. I am the proud father of two Golden Retrievers (Rocky and Jackson) who are near and dear to my family as our loving pets. Many of our CHPD staff also have family pets and we recognize how much our pets become a close part of our immediate family. Protecting pets from hidden dangers, safely recovering them when they get lost, and ensuring the public safety from animals that are loose, is a priority for our community and a commitment we make to help pets stay safe.

I am pleased to announce that the City of Citrus Heights Animal Services Unit is now a part of the Citrus Heights Police Department effective January 9, 2018. The City initially contracted with the County for animal control field services from 1997 until the City General Services Department took over field operations in May of 2012. Since that time, General Services has operated with two Animal Control Officers and Program Assistants, offering a top quality service to our community and their pets. The General Services Department assigned Operations Manager Mary Poole to oversee the Animal Services Unit and she did a superb job setting up our first City run Animal Services Unit. Animal Service Officers patrol our city and respond to calls for service related to animals. They wear a uniform and have authority to enforce the Citrus Heights Municipal Code laws pertaining to animals, as well as the State laws that govern them.

The transition to the Citrus Heights Police Department will be a great supplement to an already successful team. The CHPD offers our Animal Services Unit an all-encompassing support system. CHPD has a 24/7 Dispatch center, Records counter and staff availability 6-days a week, a robust radio and Records Management System infrastructure, additional staff support, and most importantly, greater officer safety for our Animal Control Officers who work in the field and will now have immediate access to police officers on patrol for assistance.

The Animal Services team consists of Senior Animal Control Officer (ACO) Ruben Hernandez, ACO Tanya Shareef, and Program Assistant Aimee Rolf, all of whom are outstanding City employees who provide top-quality customer service to our community and their pets. A third ACO will be added to the unit in early 2018. We are excited to transition Animal Services to the Police Department and are looking forward to improving an already great program!
















## Republic Services Hosts Annual Poster Contest


Each year, Republic Services, the recycling and trash company for residents and schools in Citrus Heights, hosts a poster contest in K-8 schools throughout Citrus Heights. The poster winners are featured in the annual Customer Service Calendar that is mailed out to all Citrus Heights residents. This year students were asked to draw a picture for the prompt: Which of the 4Rs is your favorite? Republic offers free in-class presentations about the 4Rs - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Rot - to elementary schools in Citrus Heights. These presentations teach students easy ways to reduce their waste and recycle properly.


Republic received over 600 submissions this year! City staff, including city council members, then voted and selected the 13 winning posters. Each winning student will be receiving a certificate of achievement and a \$25 gift card provided by Republic Services. Arlington Elementary, the school with the most participation, is being awarded \$500 by Republic Services.

The winning students and school will be recognized at the City Council meeting on Thursday, January 25. Winning students, their families, their school staff, and community members are encouraged to attend the city council meeting where the winning artwork will be displayed and the students will receive their prizes.

### **Holiday Light Recycling**

Don't know what to do with your old, broken, or unused holiday light? Don't throw them away! Bring them to City Hall and Republic Services will collect and recycle them. Drop off is open to all residents in the lobby of City Hall from Friday, December 1 to Friday, January 12.

#### **Tree Recycling**

Republic Services will pick up residential customers' holiday trees for free. Set your live tree curbside (next to your trash cart) on your regular trash collection day from **Tuesday**, **December 26 to Friday**, **January 12**.

# DON'T LEAVE YOUR LEAVES

Leaf season is among us. Please avoid raking or blowing leaves into the street to reduce the impact on the city's stormwater and drainage systems.

Republic Services provides extra leaf collection in January. Place any leaves that don't it in your green waste cart in 30-gallon plastic bags and place next to your green waste cart on your green waste collection day.

Republic Services will pick up a maximum of six 30-gallon bags of leaves at no cost.

There is a 35 pound limit per bag.



### New Mayor and Vice Mayor Selected by City Council

At their regular meeting on December 14, 2017, the Citrus Heights City Council selected Steve Miller as Mayor and Jeannie Bruins as Vice Mayor for the next 12 months. Each year, the City Council selects one of its members to serve a one-year term as mayor and vice mayor.



Steve Miller was appointed to the City Council on December 13, 2005 to fill a vacancy on the City Council. He was elected in November 2006 and reelected November 2010 and 2014.

Jeannie Bruins was elected to the City Council November 2002 and re-elected November 2006, 2010 and 2014



## **The Planning Division Update**

The Planning Division coordinates the City's review of residential and commercial development projects. The Division evaluates each project for compliance with the City's General Plan, Zoning Code, and other City Standards.

Below is a selected list of projects currently under review:

**7925 Arcadia Drive – Mitchell Farms :** An application was received to develop a 39 acre parcel into a new development with a variety of housing types for a total of 261 units. The project is currently in the environmental review process.

**6920 Auburn Boulevard – Stock Ranch Pad Building :** An application is under review to allow the construction of a 10,000 sf multi-tenant pad building within the Stock Ranch Development.

**7000 Auburn Boulevard – Costco Gas Station Expansion :** An application is under review that would allow the addition of 3 pump dispensers (6 filling locations) to the existing gas station.

**7766 Auburn Boulevard – California Quick Slice :** An application is under review that would allow the conversion of a former gas station into a take-out/drive-thru pizza restaurant. The permit will include an addition drive-thru window, exterior building renovations and landscaping.

**8501 Auburn Boulevard – Studio Movie Grill :** An application has been submitted that would reformat an existing vacant space (former K-Mart store) into a movie theater with food and drink service.

**7291 Greenback Lane – Hop Crawler :** The City Council recently approved an application for the issuance of a Type 42 beer & wine license that would allow the serving of beer samplings of local brews and micro brews as well as offer a full service growler filling station.

**7850 Lichen Drive – McDonald's :** An application is under review for the remodel of the existing restaurant with the installation of a new parapet, trellis/canopy and paint.

### **The Planning Division Update Continued**

**7117 Oakberry Way – Well Reactivation. :** Cal-Am Water is proposing to reactivate a non-operational well. The reactivation will include the installation of a new pump system and storage equipment.

**7534 Old Auburn Road – Bearpaw Village :** This 43-unit townhome project is scheduled for the January 24 Planning Commission hearing. **5511 Sunrise Boulevard – Citrus Heights Retail Center :** An application has been filed to demolish the former Logan's Restaurant and rebuild the site with a new multi-tenant retail building.

**6041/6199 Sunrise Boulevard** –: Applications were received to subdivide portions of the parking area of Sunrise Mall into individual parcels. One parcel is located where the existing US Bank is located and the other is the area of the Elephant Bar Restaurant.

**7056 Sunrise Boulevard – Arco Gas Station and Car Wash :** Review of a Use Permit and Design Review Permit to allow the construction and operation of a new gas station with convenience store and car wash.


The area groups usually meet once a month to solve neighborhood issues such as traffic or crime, to work on various projects, to host City information sessions, to network, have fun and much more.
