THE HISTORY AND ARTS COMMISSION OF CITRUS HEIGHTS PRESERVES AND PROMOTES THE CITY'S HISTORIC RESOURCES; FOSTERS, DEVELOPS, AND ENRICHES PROGRAMS FOR THE ARTS; AND ENCOURAGES CITIZEN PARTICIPATION IN ITS OUTREACH ACTIVITIES.

ART IN CITY HALL features the exhibitions of local artists in various buildings in the Civic Center Complex. A new exhibition is featured approximately every two months and generally includes the work of two to three artists. The public is invited to view the art collection during regular business hours. HISTORICAL PLAQUES mark various sites in the community that are of historic interest such as the Sylvan Cemetery and Rusch Home.
